Humanitarian **Kailyn Keplinger** earned the Presidential Community Service Award for her time spent volunteering with organizations in the Kansas City area, including



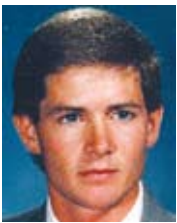
